This will result in a 0% increase to the precept in comparison to 2021-22.

This would result in a 38p per household reduction in the actual amount paid. An alternative would be to increase the precept to £23,880 (\pm £259) which would mean households pay the same amount compared to 2021-22.

Under the benchmarked budget, the Council would fund the Year 2 GreenSpace grant from reserves (£4,098). In addition, the Council anticipates the receipt of a Graveyard Grant from CWAC (£600). The total benchmark budget is therefore £28,319.

It is assumed the Council will consider feedback to proposals mentioned in the recent consultation and will consider whether to fund Year 1 costs for certain items from reserves if pursued.
